It is particularly strong in the Arab-Sasansian silver and Arab-Byzantine gold and copper issues. The two introductory sections represent significant contributions in the field. They offer the first comprehensive analysis of the monetary history of the early Islamic period since Walker's pioneering catalogues of the British Museum collections and are intended to serve as an introduction for the non-specialist as well as the numismatist.
