COMMENTARY: 30 Years in Business: Come 1 January 2006, I (Steve) will celebrate 30 years since in business. Of course, that did not mean that I wasn't trading coins "on the side" long before. Indeed, my first attempt to deal, albeit in stamps and baseball cards, was back in 1952, when I was nine years ago. Another kid and I set up our soapbox on Church Avenue in East Flatbush, Brooklyn NY, to sell or trade our excess duplicates. I think we each sold something like 75¢ each, what then delighted us a rewarding success. I can imagine my father jokingly saying that I was born with a few coins in one hand and a freshly written invoice in the other!

Of course, we only tried this a couple of times, then forgot about it, for reasons long ago lost in memory. It was only in my undergraduate days at Berkeley around 1960 that I discovered the benefits of buying coins (philately was no longer of interest) solely for the purpose of trade that would enable me to acquire more coins for my collection. At a San Francisco coin show in about 1960 I bought about a dozen Carson City mint \$5 gold coins, and traded all but one to another dealer at the same show, kept that one for my own collection, and still had a few extra dollars to paw through the foreign coin junk boxes.

At about the same time I concluded that because foreign coin collecting was far more popular in the San Francisco area than in southern California, I began driving down to Los Angeles two or three times a year to acquire unwanted foreign coins that I could swap off at Bay Area coin club meetings, and thus build up my own numismatic collection. To minimize traveling costs, I would drive my dad's extra car, a 1951 station wagon, which made campgrounds the perfect place to overnight. In LA itself, I discovered a student hotel, where you showed your University of California student card and got a room for \$17 or \$18 per week, complete with a tiny kitchen area so I could avoid restaurants and cook my own dinners. On the cheap translated into more coins for the collection!

After I started graduate studies at Berkeley in 1965, I shied away from trading on the side, as I was able to finance my collecting addiction by selling off portions of my coin collection that no longer interested me, whose value, for the most part, had steadily risen through the late 60s and early 70s.

Everything changed in 1974, when a coin dealer in New York told me that he had acquired a large accumulation of Timurid coins --- after all, I was writing my dissertation on Timurid numismatic history. The new discovery placed me in awkward position of having to rewrite almost the entire work, and that meant earning some cash to keep me going. In 1975 I spent several months working at Krause Publications on the *Standard Catalog of World Coins*. Alas, instead of banking my earnings for living costs, I drove to Minneapolis and bought what was then the second or third largest collection of Minnesota trade tokens ever assembled. When I returned to Berkeley that August I realized that I would either have to sell off parts of my collection that I preferred to retain, or trade on the side once again. At the same time I was facing the depressing realization that it would require at least six more months to rewrite the dissertation. It seemed ever more tantalizing that if I were to become a full-time coin dealer for a year or two, I would then be able to complete the "diss". But as we say, the tail wagged the dog, and I'm still a dealer to this day!
