One of very few famous shipwrecks of the Danish East India Company, the Nicobar was outbound to India with a load of Swedish copper 'plate money'. Demonetized in 1777, these plates were being shipping to India for manufacture into Danish Indian coinage. But, the Nicobar never reached its destination: After stopping at False Bay (Valsbaai) South Africa to replenish supplies and offload sick crew, the ship left again on July 10, 1783, and ran aground in a storm that night. The wreck was rediscovered in 1987 by local fishermen, who salvaged some 3,000 copper plates. According to Tingstrom there are 1132 examples known including 1101 pieces form the Nicobar wreck of this date and denomination.

At the beginning of May 1676, Dutch admiral Jacques Blinck attacked the island of Cayenne and forced the French garrison of Fort Sanit Michel to surrender. As soon as this news was known in France, Louis XIV sent Count Jean de Estrees, vice-admiral of the French fleet, with some ships to take the island back from the Dutch. The French squadron arrived at Cayenne on the first days of December, and on the 19th of the same month, after a vigorous attack, the Dutch garrison surrendered to the French. It was to commemorate this event that Louis XIV caused this medal to be struck.

Henry Christophe (or Christopher, as he referred to himself) remains one of the most fascinating figures in Haiti's turbulent history. He was one of the main heroes of Haiti's Independence struggle alongside future Emperor Jean Jacques Dessalines. Following the latter's assassination in October 1806, Christophe took control of the Northern part of the island and was elected President of the nascent State of Haiti on February 17, 1807 (Alexandre Petion would be elected President of the Republic of Haiti in the South). He would later proclaim himself Emperor of the northern Kingdom of Haiti on March 26, 1811. One of his first measures as acting President was to address the problem of the circulating media which represented a multitude of issues from different monetary standards. Authorized by decree of September 2, 1807, the issues of 1807-1809 were minted at a rudimentary facility directed by Engineer Faraud from dies manufactured by engraver Auberg. Despite being struck under the authority of the aforementioned State of Haiti, this charming issue nevertheless clearly reveals Christopher's already strong authority since it depicts his "HC" monogram and personal coat of arms on the reverse.



Following a recent article by Carlos Jara, the LVO "local arms" type issued in 1810 can now safely be considered the first Independent coinage of Mexico while the LVO "royal arms" type of 1810-1811 was a royalist issue and accepted as such by the royalist authorities of the time. Among other unearthed contemporary sources by Jara, an edict issued by Viceroy Calleja published in the Gaceta del Gobierno de Mexico dated May 14, 1811 reads: "In order not to hinder the payments and trades in the commerce, I hereby declare as current and legal tender the provisional coinage minted in that city [of Zacatecas] ... by disposition of the legitimate authorities ... due to the lack of circulating media and the fact that said coinage has a greater intrinsic value than the one with the bust of the King... However, this authorization must be understood as concerning only the mentioned provisional coinage [LVO "royal arms" type], and not the one issued by the insurgents since all of that coinage [of the insurgents] - which is well known - will have to be recalled in accordance with Article 13 of the Proclamation dated March 20. ...it is warned to everyone that the circulation of the coinage minted in that same locale [of Zacatecas] by the insurgents - which is well known and can be distinguished by the fact that it bears a kind of nopal or branch instead of lions in the Royal Coat of Arms - is hereby prohibited.'

According to Grigore, the 1904 monetary system functioned well up to World War I, when Panama's .900 fine silver coinage virtually disappeared from circulation due to a spike in the price of silver. Silver doubled in price and the silver coinage was hoarded or exported for melting. By this time, though, U.S. coinage was then in circulation and a coin shortage was averted. The melting did have the effect of making this series much scarcer than its mintage figures would lead one to believe.
