| 1041 | ADDITIONAL INFORMATION – An interesting note from Vladimir Suchy on Zeno.ru (Zeno-202600):              |
|      | "Káthirí sultán was not an issuer is this (token) coinage, but it was al-Káff sayyid of Tarím. Coinage  |
|      | was modeled on pattern of "merchant tokens" known in SE Asia (Singapore etc.). Struck was just          |
|      | one denomination colloquially called "sayf wa mízán" (i.e. sword and scales), though of different       |
|      | weights - initially coins were heavier. Known are machine and hand struck coins, the former struck      |
|      | abroad, probably at Soho mint, and hand struck were made locally, either officially at Tarím or         |
|      | "privately" as counterfeits."   |
| 1059 | UPDATED DESCRIPTION – AUSTRIA: Karl VI, 1711-1740, AR thaler, "1721", KM-1594, Dav-1053, Hall           |
|      | Mint issue, four small flan flaws to left of portrait, mount expertly removed, lightly toned, EF.       |
|      | This is a modern made piece from Bavaria circa 1900 for using for jewelry, especially for Bavarian      |
|      | traditional clothing and known as "Trachtenketten" or "Charivari". They were made of silvered brass     |
|      | and the letters are very modern comparing with old thalers. They were likely produced by Lauer in       |
|      | Nürnberg.   |
| 1122 | UPDATED DESCRIPTION – FRANCE: AR medal (16.06g), 1814, 33mm, Paris Municipal Smallpox                   |
|      | Vaccinations silver medal by Francois Depaulis (signed on obverse DEPAULIS F), EX INSPERATO             |
|      | SALUS, bull with smallpox vaccination needle above // VACCINATIONS MUNICIPALES DE PARIS                 |
|      | MDCCCXIV, ARGENT and privy mark on edge, all within wreath, lovely old rainbow toning, UNC              |
|      | Later official restrike of the Paris mint with Cornucopia (Corne d'abondance), struck from 1880 to 1898 |
|      | and again in 1901.  |
