263	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - Arran mint, dated AH 184 (date & mint omitted in the printed catalog)
351	CORRECTION – IMPORTANT UPDATED INFORMATION: The mint is definitely not al-Mansuriya or al-Mahdiya, but must be another North African locality, and is engraved similarly to the AH414 dinar of Barqa, an extremely mint, especially for al-Zahir. It not Barqa, it must be another mint name that has never been seen before, but that it unlikely. So most likely it is Barqa, now in the coastal region of modern Libya.

1502	CORRECTION - This is the <u>same</u> set that was sold in our Auction 24 (Lot 2242) PROVENANCE - Acquired directly from the London Royal Mint in 1952. Thereafter deaccessioned and sold unslabbed Noble Australia Auction 91 lot 2271 2009. Also ex Dix Noonan Webb Auction 128 Lot 409 2015/02 where it hammered for 2000 pounds (\$3050 at the time). Possibly the finest set in existence!

1620	UPDATED ATTRIBUTION - SPAIN: Philip II, 1556-1598, AR 4 reales (13.31g), "Granada", DM, C-198 (page 192), cob type, contemporary imitation, with single schroff mark, VF
1637	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - Grading body is PCGS.
1687	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - In our opinion, and in the opinion of several other experts, this is a proof strike and not a mint state example.
1715	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - Recent research has reassigned this piece to the Alchon Huns ruler Toramana, ca. 490-515, who took on the title of Prakasaditya. Jan Lingen noted that the letter below the Horse can be read as either "ru" or "u", possibly standing for Udayaditya, citing the important article confirming the re-attribution to Toramana: Pankaj Tandon ("The Identity of Prakasaditya," Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society, Volume 24, Issue 4, October 2014, pp. 557-572) has shown conclusively that Prakasaditya was in fact the Huna king Toramana.
1810	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - Al-Muzaffar also cites 'Abd Allah III below the obverse (al-Muzaffar is below the reverse).
1889	CORRECTION - Mint is Akbarabad.
1967	ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - Small mount removed, noticeable on the surface and on the edge
