<u>Discount Schedule:</u> Remaining coins from lists 101-102 are now available at 10% discount, except bullion-related items. Serious counteroffers for old stock may be considered.

Returns: Please return coins in their original envelopes, without folding them or writing on them (except to correct my mistakes), so I can return them to stock without writing up new ones. Thanks!

Want Lists: I accept want lists and keep them on file for 3 months, longer if you so request. It is important for me to work closely with my customers, and Doug and I shall try to meet all reasonable requests.

Attribution Service: The charge is \$2 per coin for basic identification, \$5 per coin for full cataloguing. However, I will identify up to five coins for each customer at no charge (except postage & insurance). This exemption is for collectors only, not for dealers. On all shipments, you pay postage & insurance and assume risk in transit. Turnaround time one to three weeks.

Show Schedule: Next on the schedule is the winter Long Beach show, at the Long Beach convention center, 2-6 February 1994 (note that there is an extra charge to attend on Wednesday the 2nd), under the rubtic of World Treasure Trading, together with Jim Anderson, table 377. The enlargement of the convention center is now nearly complete.

The following show will be Chicago in April. More details later.

Invoice number: Please be sure to mention the invoice number with all returns and payments, to assure proper credit and facilitate matters for us. Nobody enjoys paperwork.

COMMENTARY (14 January 1994) — Since I need to get this list to the printer very shortly, I shall be short on hot air this time. The New York show was very successful as a buying venture, and I shall have some exciting coins on the next photo list (#104), which should be out just after the Long Beach show. My venture down to the land of alligators was not a successful business venture. There was little to buy, perhaps because I had scarfed up everything at New York, and few dealers or wholesalers had added to their stocks over the holidays. I doubt I'll return to the FUN show again, unless I arrange a special deal or need to view a collection in the area.

This is my 18th year as a professional dealer, and with the economies of the West on the upswing, it should be a great year. Best 1994 to all of you out there! And thanks for making my 1993 a success.
