30-day and 60-day layaway plans available to established buyers.

COMMENTARY (1 April 1994) — This list has been slightly delayed, as I have been preoccupied with other business matters. This list will be followed by a second non-photo list, to be mailed out while I am away in Europe. List 107 will be a photo list.

I have recently added a second phone line to the office. If you dial the 526-3421 number, it will automatically roll over to the new number if the 3421 line is busy. Either line will also activate the answering machine, at least that is how I have set things up for now. This should make it easier to get through to Doug or me when the orders start rolling in rapidly after a new list is mailed.

I have also purchased a copier, as I have long been sick and tired of running down to Kinko's every time I needed a copy of something or another. I purchased the Sharp SF-2010, a new model that incorporates most of the features generally associated with a business-level machine but at a more affordable price. So far I am very pleased with it. The only difficulty was rearranging the office to find space for it.

And just to round out the office, I added a CD-ROM drive to my computer (Macintosh Centris 650), which I have so far utilized only for recreational purposes. I bought DeLorme's *Street Atlas USA*, which has a complete US road atlas, down to about 1:10,000 resolution, on one compact disc. This new technology is amazing. The maps are somewhat primitive and a bit stylized, but they still have the entire country, 4 million miles of roads and streets, on one CD!
