



**COMMENTARY** (31 August 1994) — Technically, with just hours to go before the new months rolls on in, I can still call this, in good conscience, the August list. What's a little procrastination, anyhow? Around here, nothing other than a time-tested tradition.

As sometimes happens when I try to write the hot air column, my mind closes up and nothing seems to get written. I've already tried a political theme, but could not find a way to fit it into the few inches of available space. Then I thought perhaps a piece on legislative constipation and special interest domination of government in the US, but that too demanded excess verbosity. So instead I seem to be writing a column about writing columns. One could call that meta-journalism, which is probably but a fancy word for "hot air," itself a euphemism for a more malodorous barnyard feature.

And this brings to the twin of procrastination, which is failure to write down a good idea when it whizzes through my skull. Much time spent agonizing over what to write is devoted to the frustrating exercise of trying to recall something that seemed like a great idea once before. Or worse, trying to find the scrap of paper on which I jotted down that idea, on the rare occasion that I acted so efficiently as to actually put pen to paper, or fingers to keyboard. Still worse, and fortunately a rare occurrence (just once so far) is trying to decipher traces of writing on the scrap of paper that just enjoyed a journey through the laundry.

Of course, there is a very effective mechanism for remembering those wonderful ideas I had once entertained. Very simply, all I need do is complete this column, take the copy to the printer. Usually within 30 or 45 seconds, after leaving the printer, all those great but unused ideas assault my mind in rapid succession. Lot of good it does then!

Now it seems that about two years ago I stumbled upon an electronic solution to the problem. I set up a file on my computer labeled *Hot Air*, into which I could enter ideas whenever they might occur, or at least at the next occasion I might be using the computer. The file was placed in the *pricelists* folder, where its bright little icon would stare me in the face every time I would work on a pricelist. However, the file developed the magical ability to steer my eyes away from itself, even as those eyes stared down its icon.

Perhaps the ultimate solution is simply to surrender to reality, and cease trying to impose an artificial structure on a process that cries out to be utterly unstructured, just like its barnyard equivalent. All ideas should be categorically ignored until the moment the last coin description is entered, the formatting finessed, and nothing remains but this column. Then, when I know how much space is left for this column, I should simply fill it with whatever happens to materialize in my brain at the moment. Not a very elegant choice, but in fact the trusty solution used approximately 100% of the time.
