COMMENTARY (1 July 1995) — Much as I try to get the books back on the shelves, other matters arise and the reshelving gets postponed. Of course, once on the shelves, there is no guarantee that I will remember where I reshelfed them. And there are still uncounted boxes of miscellaneous things scattered about, crying out to be emptied of their contents, but where does one find the time to do all this. Thus the old army saying, "three moves equal one fire." Nonetheless I am gradually getting used to the new premises, which I must say are far more amenable to my way of life than the old place. For one thing, I am able to separate the business in one room, so that it impinges minimally on the rest of my life. With a spare bedroom for guests, I no longer feel so embarrassed at having friends over. Then there is that quintessential California amenity, the hot tub (often incorrectly called a jacuzzi), which proved its mettle when I sprained my back last month. A few minutes' exercise and ten minutes in the tub, and soon the pain was gone.

For the first time since 1983, the American Numismatic Association is having its annual coin show in California, at the Anaheim convention center, across the road from Disneyland. Once the world's premier collector organization, the ANA has degenerated into a half-baked trade association that has yet to define its role in the hobby. Its publication, *The Numismatist*, is hardly worth a glance, and has been getting thinner every year. The organization seems to kowtow to "investment"-oriented dealers of US coins. The annual convention has become a major financial gamble, usually rendering a profit for the organization, but not really serving the interests of the average collector, looking to spend nor more than a few hundred dollars, preferably on many coins, not just one. I sometimes wonder why I remain a member. Inertia, I guess, is the principal "driving" force.

In any case, like so many of us dealers and collectors, I will trudge down to Anaheim in August, wander the floor for several days, peek in at the sometimes actually interesting collector exhibits, spend some money, try my best to avoid eating convention center food (the hot dogs are probably really made from dogs), and plan to attend next year as well. C'est la vie!
