COMMENTARY (15 November 1995) — Not much room for hot air this month. Gingrich, Gramm, Gephardt, Clinton and the rest are supplying more than enough to go round. Would it be that the government shutdown would show that all were unnecessary in the first place, but alas, that does not seem to be the case. Whether we like it or not, most of the services are essential to somebody. But they should be scaled back or cut out in an orderly fashioned, by the public and their elected officials, not indiscriminately with a butcher knife. Perhaps the Italians have the best answer. They and their government services seem to have survived quite well with hardly any semblance of a functioning government for half a century.

I just returned from three weeks in Europe, and found rather little to buy, other than three collections, none of them particularly inspiring, that I had lined up in advance. A lot of cheap material, not much that is really interesting. There seems to be an increase in the amount of ordinary material on offer, a decrease in interesting stuff. Is this not part of the natural process of market maturation?
