

COMMENTARY (22 May 1996) — Somehow or other, it has been over two months since I last hunkered down and produced a pricelist. My trip to Singapore and Hong Kong was exciting, and somewhat useful from a business point of view. Hong Kong was essentially a short holiday, and a badly needed one at that. Unfortunately, a few days after I returned, I was hit with the worst case of the flu I have endured in many years. For more than a week, I was hardly able to get any work accomplished, and fell way behind in correspondence. Two weeks ago, I came down with that insidious American allergic illness known as poison oak, the bane of hikers and outdoorsmen.

But all was not so bleak. I have purchased a lot of less expensive but interesting coins over the past few weeks, and have spent much time on research, including the revision of the *Checklist*. I will not, as once assumed, follow up the first edition with a photo version. Rather, I will revise and expand the text, which will be published separately. Then, as soon as I am outfitted with the new technology for directly imaging coins into the computer, I will begin assembling photos for a photo supplement. Right now I am revising the listings, adding types (mainly rarities), correcting errors (and there were quite a number), clarifying listings that are currently somewhat ambiguous (there are lots of these!), and generally editing the existing text. It is anticipated that the new edition will list 4500 or more types, but there will be no changes of catalog numbers for types currently included, except in a couple of cases where I got it all wrong in the first edition. This is no marathon project, but something I turn to whenever I have some spare time, or whenever someone points out a correction or a suggestion for improvement (keep sending in your comments, please).

(continued from list 123) The American "slab" market went into orbit during the late 1980s. The "bid" price for a pre-1921 Morgan dollar in Mint-State 65 ("Gem Uncirculated") roared above \$500 in 1989, and held there for many months. The turning point coincided with the ANA convention in Seattle in August 1990. For several months, rumors of weakness in the market for investment coins, as they were termed, circulated clandestinely. The most perspicacious dealers must have realized by March or April that the market was about to slow down, for the differential between buy and sell quotes had begun to grow, a sure sign of lack of confidence. At the 1990 August ANA, the trade was treated to what was billed as the first international seminar on coin investment, with a lavish buffet dinner and free-flowing booze. A friend persuaded me to join him, so I sat through nearly five hours of talks, mostly boring and often self-serving rantings. We were promised a market that would generate billions in profits, as rare coins would become the investment medium of choice for the smart money.

Nonetheless, something was rotten, and no quantity of hype could overcome the stench. There were rumors that a coin investment fund sponsored by Merrill-Lynch had failed to raise its initial capitalization, that it was in fact more than 50% short of what was needed (\$75m, if I remember correctly). By the end of 1990, the game was over. MS65 Morgans fell below \$100 bid by the end of 1991. Sure, there are still lots of slabbed coins there, mainly US, and fortunately, no Islamic or Indian coins whatsoever, and there are still those hoping for a magic recovery. But by and large, coins are losing their role as investment vehicles and are become once again objects of collection, as they ought to be.

Fortunately, my market has been little affected by all this silliness. Perhaps the only vestige is that more of my customers demand higher grades than before, but only marginally more. However, there have been other developments since 1990 that have profoundly changed the distribution of the types of coins I handle (to be continued...).
