



COMMENTARY (13 February 1997) — I can hardly believe that it has been nearly five months since I last typed a photo list. One result has been that I have an unusually large number of rarities to offer this time.

Now that I have been home from England for more than seven weeks, I am right back into the old routine. Sales have been good, and I am now quite confident that business will continue to do well in the next couple of years—beyond that, nobody can predict.

Both while in Oxford and subsequently, I have been updating the *Checklist*, in preparation for a new edition sometime later this year. I have thus far made hundreds of emenditions, additions, explanatory notes, etc. With very few exceptions, the original catalog numbers have been maintained. New entries have a letter before or after the number (e.g., A1231, B1231, or 1231A, 1231B), or a point number (1231.1, 1231.2); the point numbers are used where an existing type is broken down into subtypes.

Several new features are being added as well. For most dynasties, I am adding a short explanatory note giving the most common mints for that dynasty (or for certain types within the dynasty), as well as an indication of the condition and quality of strike that the collection is likely to find. For the Umayyad dirhams, I have given an indication of the rarity of each mint. For the Abbasid dirhams and dinars, I have broken down each entry into various types, as defined by the names and titles found on the coins. The bibliographical references have also been somewhat expanded.

In a few cases, I have had to completely rewrite certain sections. Foremost amongst these are the later Aq Qoyunlu, the first 80 years or so of the Safavids, and much of the later Zand and early Qajar coinage. These emendations have been largely the fruit of my Oxford research, during which I was able to uncover much new data about these areas, enough to make clear that what I had written in the first edition was just plain wrong.

There are still a few months before I go to press, and I would be interested in hearing from all of you with further comments, suggestions, additions, or corrections. The format will be precisely the same as the first edition, but the number of pages has already increased from 68 to 104+. The new edition, like the first, will be text only, so that I can keep the price low. At some point, hopefully in 1997 or early 1998, I will start gathering together photos of about 1000 mostly common types, with the intention of issuing a photo supplement. This will enable those on a limited budget to acquire the text cheaply. Otherwise, the price for both parts as a single volume would be several times as high.

I have recently been comtemplating the possibility of establishing a Web Page. Right now, inertia and the fact that I am an internet "dummy" are keeping me from moving forward. I would be interested in hearing from my customers about their possible interest in e-shopping for coins. I guess my first step should be to buy an "internet for dummies" type of book, and try to make some sense of it. In general I am rather slow to adopt new technology; after all, I still much prefer my trusty old Gillette safety razor to these no-longer-so-newfangled electric shavers. As for the internet, have any you had especially good or bad experiences buying coin electronically? If so, I would be interested in hearing your experiences.
