**COMMENTARY** (29 September 1997) — This will be my last hot air page before I leave next Monday for Oxford. I will instruct Doug, however, to add my Oxford telephone number and email address, as soon as I get them. Doug and I will be in daily communication by email and frequently by telephone as well.

My trip to Australia and New Zealand was quite successful, by which I mean that I had a great holiday. I spent a week in and around Sydney, walking miles and miles every day (even in the rain), visiting some of the tourist sites, checking out the numismatic scene, and spending a delightful weekend with Colin & Sandy Pitchfork at their "dacha" on Lake Conjola, some 200 km south of Sydney. One evening I attended a meeting of the Sydney ancient numismatic society, which takes place monthly in the rather cramped quarters of Noble Numismatics' Macquarie Street office. To be sure, I checked out several of the pubs, of which I most enjoyed the Macquarie Hotel, about a five minute walk from my hotel, the Travelers Rest, in the heart of Chinatown.

After a week in Sydney, I rented a car for a leisurely ramble through the Australian countryside. My route went through, to name just a few of the towns I traversed, Katoomba, Mudgee, Dubbo, Brewarrina, Bourke, Wilcannia, Broken Hill, Nhill, Coonawarra, the Grampians National Park, ending up in Melbourne. Amongst the highlights were wine-tasting in Mudgee and the Coonawarra Valley, having a few beers at the Silverton Hotel (famous from its appearance in more than a dozen feature films and untold commercials), the remarkable Western Plains zoo at Dubbo, and of course, just driving through the endless nothingness of the outback. In three days in the Grampians, I did lots of walking, with the best the hike to the summit of Mount Difficult, which I can assure you is quite appropriately named. The trail is poorly marked, and there is quite a bit of scrambling on all fours to get through some of the rockier sections. Really a great workout. I also much enjoyed many evenings having a few beers in the pubs, meeting the local residents and learning as much as I could in three weeks about Australian society.

From Melbourne I flew to Auckland, where I stayed for five days in the suburb of Takapanu. Tired of sightseeing, I spent most days at my resort hotel working on the new edition of the Checklist on my laptop, heading out for great food and drink every evening, and just taking it a bit easy. Except for the last day, it rained just about the entire time I was there, in counterpart to the excellent (though often cold) weather I had encountered in Australia.

The second edition of the Checklist is just about done, and none too soon, for I have very few copies left of the first edition. The text portion will be 136 pages long, exactly twice as fat as the first. My hopes for completing the text before I leave for Oxford have come to nought, but I will have more spare time at Oxford to finish the details and do the final proofreading. In fact, I am leaving for Kinko's in just a few moments to run off copies of the manuscript for the volunteer proofreaders. Besides the addition of about 1000 further types and subtypes, I have added a lot of explanatory material, most of it in response to comments from you the readers. Here are few new features: (1) Indication of available mints for most dynasties. (2) Indication of condition range and quality of strike that can be expected. (3) Rarity charts for silver mints for the Umayyads and Abbasids. (4) Expanded bibliographical references, though I'll save the best of this for the inevitable third edidtion. The format and style remain the same. And as I have noted before in this hot-air column, I have done my damnest to keep the same numbers as in the first edition, though in some cases, where major revisions were deemed necessary, this was not possible. And some sections, such as the Qarakhanids, the Aq Qoyunlu, the early Safavids and the post-Ilkhan dynasties of Iran, have been thoroughly revised.

Conventional Usage — 1. Parentheses () around a mint or date mean that the mint or date is inferred and is not visible on the coin. Square brackets [] mean that the enclosed portion is inferred but is not present in the die. In general, () indicates an inferior specimen, but [] never does.

- 2. The abbreviation *temp*. is used when assigning anonymous coins to a specific ruler.
- 3. On Indian coins of the princely states and colonial powers, the term san ("year") indicates a frozen year. The frozen year served the function of a mintmark.
