COMMENTARY (1 June 1999) - Since there is room for some hot air I shall add my two cents' worth, as one would have said back in the days when two cents could actually buy something.

I am leaving later this afternoon to return to Oxford for my penultimate stretch of time there. The first volume of the sylloge is just about finished. All that remains is to prepare the TIFFs and send them to the printer. We are looking to mid-June for the "handover" of the TIFFs. The second volume is essentially written, but still in need of refinement, proofreading and the like. Moreover, we have yet to get the coins photographed, but that is scheduled for the week of 8 June.

The Oxford sylloge photography is being done digitally, using a new digital camera feeding into a Macintosh G3 laptop, backed up by Jazz drives, each of which can hold the images of about 800-1000 coins (compressed files). The photographers, Jan Starnes and David Darrens of Leighton Buzzard, England, are enthusiastic about this new technology, and they have persuaded me that it is indeed the way of the future. Jan and David are also preparing auction catalogues for Italo Vecchi (London), and have done some work for the Barber Institute in Birmingham. I expect that virtually the entire auction catalog scene will do digital within the next few years.

Unfortunately, top-quality digital photography is still expensive, at least the initial investment, over \$10,000, not including the computer and the Jazz drives and discs. Those prices are already 1/3 of what it cost just three years ago, and will be coming down. When it reaches \$5000 or less, I might just spring for my own system.

But first I must work on getting my website up and running, planned for the end of this year, a millenium gift to myself. First I need to upgrade all my hardware. I'm already finding that much downloadable software will not run on my now rather ancient 68040 chip based Centris 650. I expect to buy the G3 after my return in October, then add a scanner and whatever other peripherals are needed. For the short-term I do not plan to put my regular pricelists on the site, but will reserve it for special offers, especially items I have in quantity.

The weather here in Santa Rosa is miserable for late May and June. They say it is La Niña, which cools the eastern and central Pacific, causing drier winters in California with more frost than usual (over 60 nights of frost this year in Santa Rosa!), and cool summers that continue to feel like early spring. Right now it is cold, thoroughly overcast and drizzling lightly. So I'll be warming up in England. The "Icy" signs are still up on the passes over the nearby hills (elevation no more than 1500 feet).
