**COMMENTARY** (15 March 2000) — This is the first list typed on my new computer, the Macintosh G4. This machine is so fast, virtually instantaneous for most uses. I had my first experience on a G4 in January in Oxford, and that only whetted my appetite. I have also upgraded from the now somewhat ancient Word 5.1 to Word 98. Some things work very differently in the new software, especially the renumbering tool, with the result that there are some minor differences in formatting (try to find them!). Before long, probably after my second three-month stint in England in the spring of 2001, I will purchase a good digital camera, PhotoShop and either QuarkExpress or InDesign, in order to produce photo lists entirely digitally. I anticipate that the cost of the camera and software, which are all quite expensive, will be recouped in just three or at most four lists. And I will be able to produce a photo list in a couple days, rather than nearly a month.

The biggest news on the American numismatic scene is the fifty states quarters. Each year from 1999 to 2008, the US Mint is striking five different quarters (all share a common obverse) for five different states, in the order of their admission to the Union. The quarters have been very popular amongst collectors, especially kids, and have already engendered a sea change in American collecting. Look at *Coin World* or *Numismatic News*, and whereas a couple of years ago, the adverts were dominated by offers of slabbed coins priced in the hundreds, thousands or higher, now is it cheap stuff that dominates. In many ways, it is as though the late fifties were here again. At coin fairs, where the under-30 crowd had virtually disappeared in the 80s and 90s, all of a sudden there are lots of kids and families. In other words, the low end of the market has undergone a massive revival. Since in my opinion, the numismatic market is like a pyramid whose base should be a large number of collectors on very modest budgets, I view the current developments as therapeutic. And they come at the same time that the internet has made possible the selling of cheap coins, which have been avoided by dealers for the simple reason that the base of that pyramid was too small and fragmented to justify stocking them, as they can only be profitably handled when there are a large number of buyers. That condition seems to be about to be met once again, as has not been the case in more than 25 years.

If you use cello tape when returning a coin, please use just a small amount of tape on the back of the envelope only. Otherwise, the writing will peel off with the tape and we have to write out a new envelope. Thanks.
