**COMMENTARY** (10 July 2000) — This is Alexander Akin writing, rather than Stephen Alburn; as regular readers of the Commentary section know, Steve has been in England for the last two months doing research at Oxford's Ashmolean Museum. He will be back in the United States on August 4th, but will not be attending the ANA in Philadelphia as previously planned. In these last weeks before his return I will continue to take your orders. Being the sole person in the office has caused a few bottlenecks, but I hope that any delays our customers might have dealt with have not been too troublesome.

I've spoken with many of you on the telephone. A brief introduction for those who haven't met me: I'm basically a hobbyist turned professional in this field, having started out by visiting Steve each summer in Santa Rosa when I was a teenager (my father was a customer – still is, in fact). I started with Plant's book to begin deciphering inscriptions (see advert above), and with Steve's assistance and the opportunity to paw through countless thousands of coins, over the years I received a far better education in Islamic numismatics than would have been possible in most university settings. In college I focused on other fields, majoring in Anthropology with a minor on Chinese at the University of California at Riverside, then continuing with a master's at Harvard in East Asian Regional Studies. My "official" expertise is thus in Chinese history and language, though naturally I took every opportunity to bring numismatics into my coursework in other subjects! The only Muslim land I've traveled through is Xinjiang, which of course is part of China for the time being. Nevertheless, I've been working for Steve during my summer breaks for the last seven years or so doing coin identification, sorting stock, and plenty of paperwork. When Dr. Norman D. Nicol ("Doug") retired last year, Steve hired me to take his place – a formidable task, since Doug had developed an astounding ability to keep this chaos-prone office in order during his 17-year tenure.

Because I commute by bus from San Francisco, a three-hour trip each way, I usually come up to Santa Rosa, spend several days working here, then return home to The City. This means that on some business days there is no one here to speak with in person, though of course our e-mail, fax, and answering machine are on at all times. Hopefully this inconvenience is somewhat mitigated by the fact that on the days when I am here, I work until late at night and do not mind answering the phone until 11:00 PM or so. After Steve returns, though, we'll be back to a more regular schedule.

As always, the coins on this list represent only a tiny fraction of our stock, and detailed inquiries from customers are always welcome. Specific want lists make it easier for us, but we are also happy to talk with beginning collectors who are looking for a bit of this and that and have not yet decided on a specialty. Recently I have listed some of my own duplicate coins on Ebay, the internet auction site, with Stephen Alburn advertisements attached. Just as I suspected, there were many collectors out there who had no idea where to go to find a firm specializing in Islamic coins, and quite a few have now joined our mailing list as a result of this publicity. Buying coins online has its share of risks, mostly quite minor, but the presence of this venue has made it dramatically easier for buyers and sellers to find each other. Perhaps more importantly, the internet has also allowed scholars and collectors to share their queries and theories with an expanding circle of interested parties who might never have met each other in the past.

Because some of our customers in the Middle East have had the unfortunate experience of receiving the list long after the juiciest bits have been picked from it, I am trying a new mailing schedule which will hopefully get the list to everyone at about the same time.
