COMMENTARY (28 October 2000) — This time it is once again Steve preparing this list and writing this commentary. My recovery is moving along much better and faster than the doctors had at first feared, though I still lack considerable hearing in my left ear (right ear is close to normal) and can read only slowly. The reading problem is the same that I had when I was in my teens, but is improving quickly; however, I will probably always read slowly, as I have had to for most of the past 45 years. Although the accident was not caused by alcohol, I have decided to quit drinking. The doctor has recommended that I switch no non-alcoholic bear, which is now widely available in the United States, in supermarkets, restaurants, even bars. There is no doubt that I was often drinking excessively from the late 1980s until two months ago, and I have for years been wanting to either quit completely or reduce to very limited amounts of bear and wine. Now I will avoid all alcohol, except once in the while a single class of high quality wine with a restaurant meal. The is also my doctor's advice.

By the way, just about two weeks ago I celebrated 31 years of non-smoking. I had my last cigarete on 16 October 1969, which driving home—I then was living in Vallejo—from a coin show in Sacramento. In my current house I don't even allow my friends to smoke indoors.

Another major task is to revive my activity within the business. It was extremely difficult to keep my business in best shape during the past five years, of which I spent more than three years abroad, mainly in Oxford, England. Right now I am spending a couple of hours every date solding old papers, letters and business records, finishing the job of sorting even older material that I stashed in the Garage in several dozen cardboard boxes when I moved into this house in May 1995.

Finally, during the period of my worst illness, Alexander Akin spent a lot of his time running the business, answer mail and email, maintaining the house and paying bills. His cousin Huck also spend some days with me here and helped me considerably. I deeply appreciate their effort and their undertaking of all manner of necessary matters.

And now to business. Basically, there will be few changed in the next year or so, but I do have some plans. Over the years I have accumulated a large quantity of lower value coins, mostly copper and silver, but also some gold, which I will gradually remove from my basic stock books and ofter in group sales at very cheap prices. More about this in the next non-photo list (late December or early January), for by then I will have figured out just how to manage large quantities of such material. If any of you have some ideas or suggestions, feel free to phone or email us.

In virtually every area of numismatics, the price difference between lower and greater condition coins has increased substantially over the past several years. It began with American coins in the 1970s, for which it has now reached unimaginable records. The finest known uncirculated 1919-D dime sold earlier this year at auction for about \$215,000, whereas an ordinery uncirculated dime of the same year and mint is listed for \$140, or about 1/1800 as much. Such silly differences have not hit Islamic and Indian coins, but the difference between average or below average specimens and especially well struck and preserved specimens has increased greatly. You have probably all noted that my prices for better quality coins—except for those that have turned up recently in large quantities—has been increasing over the past several years, whereas prices of lower quality coins has stayed the same or decreased. In fact, in the next several years I plan to offer lots of lower quality or very common coins at significantly cheaper rates. Anyone interested?
