COMMENTARY (28 December 2000) — Over the past couple of years I have received numerous requests from customers about when I would accept Credit Card payments. Due to the high cost of credit card payments, I continue to resist that now rather ancient technology. However, there is a new faster and less expensive means of payment that can be easily utilized via the internet, called PayPal. The costs to me are currently about half that of credit cards and the time delay is practically zero. For how to use PayPal, see the description just about the first coin entry in this pricelist. For those who intend to use this method, it is very fast (normally about one minute of effort), costs nothing and requires nothing more than an internet access at home or at work.

Don't forget that most of my price lists will appear also at my current internet address, <http://stevealbum.virtualave.net>, which you may use whenever you wish.

As you all know, my large lists (500-700 coins) bear no photographs or illustrations. So far, we have limited the number of coins scanned to the internet list version to just a few dozen. Why is this the case? The answer is that for the large quantity of inexpensive coins on our lists, it would be extremely costly to add scans or other images to the list. At present, scanning a coin, obverse and reverse, and assuring that the illustration quality is good, takes 5-10 minutes per coin. Eventually, when I acquire a digital camera, the time per coin will be reduced to about 3-4 minutes each. This would still mean that to illustrate all the coins on a list containing 600 pieces would require a minimum of 30 hours of rather boring work. If you wonder why auction catalogs have lots of illustrations on their internet version, the answer is simple; they have already photographed all the coins for the sale catalog, and the conversion of the catalog photos to internet illustration uses just a small fraction of the time needed for new illustrations. At the present, Alexander and I can sometimes produce a few scanned illustrations for the internet catalog of for email to customers, but only when our work demands leave us with some free time. In general, it is far easier for us to ship the coins, have you look them over, and return the ones that are of no interest. If any of you have further ideas of how to improve this aspect of our business, feel free to call us and present your ideas.

POSTAGE STAMPS: I very much appreciate receiving attractive stamps on incoming mail. No, I am not a collector and I do not make money by selling them. Rather, I give them to Doug Nicol and his father, who are both collectors and who also pass on most of the stamps to other collectors, mainly through their church in Shavertown, Pennsylvania. My sole interest is a few minutes examining the stamps before I send them away.

The Tehran bus tokens were largely found by me, back in 1965, when I was living in Tehran. I acquired about 700 pieces in all from a scrapmetal dealer in the Tehran Bazar. I sold most of these through the American Vecturist Association, of which I've been a member since 1962. I purchased the group offered here from a token collector in California a few years ago, and finally got round to offering them for sale. By the way, I am still an avid token collector, specially interested in recent, post-1977, California tokens of all sorts.
