COMMENTARY (3 February 2001) — January was quite a hectic month, with two extremely busy weeks in Oxford completing the final editing of volume 9 of the Sylloge of Islamic Coins in the Ashmolean (see information above). There is still some tweaking here and there, and I still have to complete the mint maps (hopefully this afternoon, now that I've just about finished typing this list). Luke Treadwell has helped me considerably, carefully proofreading my material very carefully. Both Luke and I found lots of errors, misspellings, wrong numbers, etc., but virtually no major problems. Now I just have to take a few hours to prepare the map, which will later be properly edited by someone in Oxford.

Also in Oxford, I worked with my co-author Tony Goodwin to more or less finalize the setup of volume 1, for which I am covering the Arab-Sasanian coins and Tony the Arab-Byzantine. This will contain only about 740 coins, naturally all of them illustrated, but both Tony and I are composing lengthy introductions, each of us attempting to analyze current knowledge and research in our respective fields. I shall be returning to Oxford for three months, beginning about the 8th of May, to complete the Arab-Sasanian section and to write the somewhat briefer sylloge volume 5, which will cover the Spanish and North African material (about 1000 coins).

There is currently a problem regarding international book mailing from the United States. At the present, there is no clear book rate whatsoever, though airmail book rate for book packets up to four pounds weight is currently \$9 to many countries. There is a cheap surface rate for packages or no more than four pounds, but it applies only to businesses sending more than 50 pounds total of parcels; it is still unclear whether the 50 pound load of packages has to be mailed at the same time, or can be mailed gradually as the orders are received. The US post office completely screwed up the international system in its attempt to introduce new rates on 7 January 2001, for reasons that are still unclear. I might add that such a mess has never occurred in the US post office since the 1930s, and nobody seems to know how it happened. One that is clear is that will be no reduced book rate for parcels weighing over four pounds, though M-Bag rates (very inexpensive) still apply to packages over 11 pounds. The craziness goes on!
