SORRY: Surface postage from the US to other countries was increased phenomenally on 7 January 2001, typically three to five times as expensive as just two years before. As a result, postage will be added to all shipments outside the US, and the amount may be shocking. Surface and air M-bags for 11 pounds or heavier shipments are still reasonable, so I advice foreign customers order together with their friends, 11 pounds (5 kilos) or heavier.

WE will soon update BOOK LIST once again to reflect our current stock; feel free to request a copy!

COMMENTARY (28 August 2001) — I returned from Oxford late last week, having nearly completed the Arab-Sasanian sylloge. This will be an important volume, with an extensive introduction (over 70 pages). The volume also included the Arab-Byzantine coinage, which has been catalogued by Tony Goodwin, who has also written an important introduction (over 40 pages). This volume will supercede all currently available general texts on these two series.

Another extremely important publication is Stan Goron and J.P. Goenka's masterly catalog of the sultanate coins of India, *The Coins of the Indian Sultanates*. Included are all the sultanates, Delhi, Bengal, Jaunpur, Gujarat, Malwa, Kashmir, and Bahmanis, plus all the minor sultanates. I've already arranged to purchase a good supply, but have not yet been able to determine what the US price will be. I anticipate a retail price in the range of \$75-85.

Joe Lang is now working fulltime with me, so there are now two of use present on a daily basis to get the business back on track. He has been a numismatist for more than 25 years and ran his own business from 1989 until 2000 in San Diego, California. I have known Joe for many years, and I am confident that he will be a highly successful addition to the company. He has a broad knowledge of nearly all kinds of World Coins, and will surely be broadening his knowledge of Islamic coinage very quickly. We have tentatively set our business hours as 9AM until 5:30PM, Monday through Friday. As usual, I will sometimes be able to answer the phone at other times.

For the near future, we will continue to issue pricelists more or less ten times per year, both photo lists of rarer coins and ordinary lists of inexpensive coins. We intend to eventually formalize my theoretical website, as it is obvious to everyone that the coin business is gradually moving over to the internet.

Don't forget that most of my price lists have been appearing at my current internet address, <http://stevealbum.virtualave.net>. However, because the person who edited my pricelist for use on that site no longer has the time to continue, the next several lists may not be available there.

Please note: For expensive coins, roughly \$150 and higher, I can usually send scans, but only if you really need to see it.
