

COMMENTARY (21 February 2002) — I'm just back from the New York show, which was remarkably successful, despite the change of date (from early December for mid-Januay) and the alleged fear of traveling to New York. The Waldorf-Astoria is a magnificent hotel, built in the early 1930s and periodically remodeled. The one drawback was that the show was partly in the large room known as the starlight roof, together with three smaller rooms, quite some distance apart, though all on the 18th floor. My table, shared with Derek Warden and Keith Candiotti, was in the starlight, which I last visited in the mid-1950s, for the wedding of a cousin! It was emotionally somewhat strange to return after roughly 45 years.

There is one favor I would like to request. While this excellent software enables us to streamline our office operation, but it does require some constraints, and one of this is the recording of payments. Thus, I would request that whenever possible our customers make payments by invoice and include the invoice number (or a copy of the invoice). Payments can be for multiple invoices, though it would help us if you mention the invoice numbers. Thanks!
