

The year MS2537 is equilvalent to the period between 21 March 1978 and 20 March 1979, thus ending more than a month after the defeat of Shah Muhammad Pahlavi by the founders of the Islamic Republic. Nonetheless, in preparation for New Years (Nowruz) 1979, the mint had already produced coins for the following year, in the Islamic Solar calender, SH1358.





Although 16th century Ottoman gold sultanis of Jaza'ir (Algiers) are reasonably common, contemporary silver nasris are extremely rare. This is the first example of Jaza'ir that I have handled.

Square silver coins were introduced circa 1170 under the Muwahhidun in numerous mints in Spain and North Africa. They were struck by the Ottomans only at mints in Algeria, Tunisia and western Libya.

The shapes of the bai jin san ping coinage have meanings deeply rooted in Chinese culture. According to Peng Xinwei in "The Monetary History of China," "the outer roundness and inner squareness of the ban liang resembled the roundness of Heaven and the squareness of Earth in the cosmology of the Chinese of those times." The bai jin dragon coins are not only round, but have a distinctive scyphate shape. One reason for this may be to emulate the heavenly skies that appear to curve around in the shape of a giant cup in order to enclose the Earth





Note that 'Iwad himself takes no formal title ("laqab"), while his heir apparent is entitled "sultan of sultans". This reflects the concept that 'Iwad was merely a governor because neither his father was sultan nor was he appointed heir to the throne. Having been appointed heir, 'Ali could adopt any title of his choice.


